ATTURBURY WASH GREENWAY MASTER PLAN

INTRODUCTION

The City of Tucson Parks and Recreation Department is working jointly with the consulting team of McGann & Associates, GLHN Architects & Engineers, RECON Environmental, Inc., Structural Grace Engineering, Inc., Terracon, and the Gordley Design Group, to prepare a Master Plan for the Atturbury Wash Greenway.

This project is to be completed in two phases:

- Phase One includes the preparation of a Master Plan for the complete Atturbury Wash Greenway from Irvington Road to the connection at the South Bank of the Pantano River Park. During Phase One, the scope and limits of the initial phase of construction will be identified.
- Phase Two of the project includes design and engineering of Phase One improvements.

CONCEPTUAL PLAN ELEMENTS

The Atturbury Wash Greenway Master Plan may include some or all of the items listed below. Additional elements may be added based on public input.

- Multiple-use Trails
- Rest nodes with seating and drinking fountains
- A bicycle and pedestrian bridge across the Atturbury Wash
- Landscape and Irrigation Improvements
- Signalized or grade separated pedestrian and bicycle crossings
- Entry monumentation and wayfinding signage
- Dusk to dawn lighting at road crossings and at public gathering areas

PROJECT STATUS

- Currently Tucson Parks and Recreation and the Consulting Team are meeting with project stakeholders and gathering site related data.
- The first Public Meeting has been scheduled for May 29, 2008. At this meeting an initial concept plan for greenway development will be presented
